"THE WAY WE ARE"

Some of the worst advice that a Christian can give is to tell someone "God loves you the way you are." Let me explain.

It is true, that God loves us *where* we are in life; at every stage. It is also true that God loves us for the Saint that we are called to be. Just as a mother loves her child at every stage; within the womb, during infancy, childhood and adulthood, so does our Father in Heaven love us at every stage. But, just as a mother's desire that her own child grow up and mature, so does the Lord desire that we grow up and mature.

Babies and toddlers, at times, will throw temper tantrums when they do not get their own way. It is by the loving guidance of father and mother that tantrum throwing babies grow into civilized adults that possess control over their own emotions. To put it simply, it may be acceptable for babies and toddlers to throw temper tantrums. It is completely unacceptable for young children and adults to throw temper tantrums.

It is true that God loves the sinner; we are all sinners. But the Lord also calls everyone one of us to "Grow Up."

In the Gospel of John, we read;

But Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. Now early in the morning He came again into the temple, and all the people came to Him; and He sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and Pharisees brought to Him a woman caught in adultery. And when they had set her in the midst, they said to Him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in adultery, in the very act. Now Moses, in the law, commanded us that such should be stoned. But what do You say?"

This they said, testing Him, that they might have something of which accuse Him. But Jesus stooped down and wrote on the ground with His finger, as though He did not hear.

So, when they continued asking Him, He raised Himself up and said to them, "He who is without sin among you, let him throw a stone at her first." And again, He stooped down and wrote on the ground. Then those who heard it, being convicted by their conscience, went out one by one,

beginning with the oldest even to the last. And Jesus was left alone, and the woman standing in the midst. When Jesus had raised Himself up and saw no one but the woman, He said to her, "Woman, where are those accusers of yours? Has no one condemned you?"

She said, "No one, Lord."

And Jesus said to her, "Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more."

Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."

John 8:1-12

Brothers and sisters in the Lord, we do no good by encouraging our fellow man to continue to walk in darkness; to walk proudly in a sinful life. It is every Orthodox Christian's duty to spiritually "grow up;" to strive to walk in the light of Christ and to go and sin no more.
