We were also able to add 2 hospitals (Lawrence General Hospital and Anna Jaques Hospital in Newburyport). When our agencies/hospitals have a newborn-in-need, a social worker contacts us to create a "tower".

We deliver the "towers" to our agencies/hospitals at no cost:). We accept new baby clothing in sizes newborn, 0–3-month, 3 month, 3-6 months and 6 months.
