St. Christina, July 24th

The daughter of a freebooting pagan who held his own child virtually captive to keep her from hearing the name of the Lord mentioned, seems an unlikely candidate for sainthood. Yet Christina became a saint under these bizarre circumstances.

Her father, Urbanus, was a man of no small means, coming by his wealth in an unscrupulous manner as a camp follower of the legions of Emperor Severus in about the year 200. After the birth of his daughter, he used his ill-gotten wealth to erect a huge tower for her, designed to admit no sound from the outside world and to allow for freedom of movement within the upper levels only, and at the very top, he installed an open terrace, thus ensuring that she would never encounter a Christian or hear of Christianity - for he feared Christianity as much as he hated it.

Christina was content initially, yet over time her native intuition told her that she was missing a great deal, and she grew weary of the tower with its pagan gods placed everywhere to remind her of her duty to her father. She found pleasure in her walks around the terrace where she gazed at the stars and pondered the wonders of nature and how it all happened in the first place. So great was her longing to learn the reason for her being that an angel of the Lord appeared to her, and in the confines of the tower she came to know God and His Son Jesus. Her joy was so great that she was eager to tell her father of her new faith, but she never got the chance because he was killed in one of the Roman forays.

Free at last, she sold everything and vowed that she would serve Jesus Christ for the rest of her life. She gave the entire proceeds to the poor and the afflicted. Possessing nothing but a love of the Savior and an eagerness to serve Him, she became an inspiring woman of the Church.

She carried the message of Christ to the pagans but failed to heed the warning that she had trod on sensitive pagan toes and found herself imprisoned. She suffered brutal tortures but endured them all with the name of the Savior on her lips. And when she spoke on even after her tongue had been cut out, the ruler Dion ordered her put to death. She died for Christ on July 24, 234. George Poulos,

I invite you all to join me on **Thursday**, **July 27th** for a morning and afternoon of jam making, Bible study and good old fashioned parea. This event is scheduled to take place in our Church Hall.

Order of events are as follows:

2:00 pm - ladle jam into sterilized jars

2:15 pm – process jars in boiling water

While jars are processing, we will clean up our tools and work station

3:00 pm - Finished!!
