Many people on the inside and outside of the Church have demanded that we change our core teachings on things such as marriage, family, and the presence of sin in our daily lives.

We forget that our Lord Jesus Christ, with love, challenges our character. In the Gospel of John 8:10-11 we read;

When Jesus had lifted up himself, and saw none but the woman, he said unto her, Woman, where are those thine accusers? hath no man condemned thee? She said, No man, Lord. And Jesus said unto her, neither do I condemn thee: go, and sin no more.

The words of Jesus are not a mere suggestion. They are a direct call to action. How committed then, are we, to serve the will of our Lord Jesus Christ even when those that we may know or even love despise us for that commitment? How committed are we?
